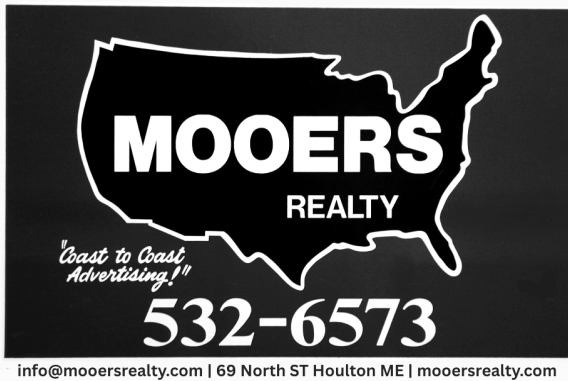

GENERAL RULES:

1. Items that have been displayed previous years at the Houlton Agricultural Fair cannot be displayed/entered again.
2. All articles/items must be made by the exhibitor under whose name they are exhibited. Goods must be finished within the past year and in new and well laundered condition.
3. Any item entered in any class where there is no competition, the prize and premium will be in the opinion of the judges at the worthiness of the entry. Premiums will only be paid if the entry meets the standards of the judges.
4. All articles/items must remain in place on display until 8:00 PM on the last date of the fair. See pick up times. Exhibits/entries removed prior to pick up date will be in violation of this rule and will result in forfeiture of any premiums won.
5. In case of dispute or misunderstanding, in any class, the decisions of the judges and/or Superintendent, will be considered fair, impartial, and final and all items are entered under these conditions.
6. If for any unavoidable reason, such as bad weather, failure to receive state stipend funds, executive orders, or any other cause beyond the Houlton Agricultural Fair's control, where there are not sufficient funds, the exhibitor must accept a discount in their prizes pro-rata with any such losses.
7. No exhibitor shall compete against himself in any class, either directly or indirectly, and any person entering borrowed articles, food, or other items, or making fraudulent representation in reference to any exhibit, will forfeit all premiums which may have been awarded.
8. The Association also reserves the right to accept or reject any entry made for any premium offered and no premium will be paid unless all requirements have been fulfilled.
9. There will be reasonable security, day and night, but the Association assumes no responsibility in case of loss, or damage to stock, or other exhibits from any cause, and on this condition only, are exhibits accepted.
10. In making your entry, you accept this as part of your contract. Rules established by Superintendents of Departments must be fully complied with. Their decisions and their respective committee members will be final.
11. Houlton Fair is not responsible for typographical errors or printing errors. Decisions of all judges or Superintendents & Department Managers in all departments are final.
12. Premiums for best in show will be awarded at the discretion of the judges and can not be entered.
13. Due to Fire Marshall and insurance regulations, no parking is permitted anywhere at the Civic Center during fair operational hours, including the lawn area on the side, the side near the bank, or in parking spots near the propane tanks. No parking signs are clearly posted. This area is used for contest drop off only during fair hours when applicable. The parking area by the propane tanks may be used for overflow handicap parking when necessary. **Agricultural exhibitors may access the parking area near livestock through the Bird Street/Houlton High School entrance. Agricultural Parking Passes will be given out upon sign up for space.**
14. Flowers under conservation will not be accepted.
15. Premium checks not cashed within 30 days from date written will be forfeited.

General Rules and Regulations

1. All animals must be at the fair no later than midnight on Thursday, July 9 th.
2. All animals must be healthy and clean. Any animal may be asked to leave if deemed unhealthy by the Livestock Superintendent or Fair Veterinarian. All animals entering the grounds must meet the health requirements of the Maine State Department of Agriculture as established for State Fairs. Details of these requirements can be obtained from the Livestock Superintendent or from the Maine State Dept. of Agriculture, Augusta, ME.
3. Animals are to stay on the fair grounds until released by the Livestock Superintendent.
4. Premiums will be given out in a Herdsmanship Competition. For Beef and Dairy you must bring a minimum of 6 Animals to compete. For Sheep and Goats you must bring a minimum of 5 animals to compete. There will also be an educational display contest.
5. All Entries are subject to approval or rejection by the Fair Veterinarian at any time during the course of the Fair.
6. Cooking and smoking are strictly prohibited in any tent, stable, or exhibit areas.
7. The Houlton Fair will, under no circumstances, be liable or responsible for any injury, losses, or damages sustained by the owner, agent, servant, employees, or animals entered in any class or exhibition while on the fairgrounds. All risks of loss, injury, damage or destruction to property or livestock are assumed in full by the owners, agents, servants, and employees; whether caused by active or passive negligence, condition of the premises or any other cause whatsoever.  - B. Cooperation With Fair Officials, Fair Goers, and Other Exhibitors-20%
 - C. Overall Look of Display – 20%
 - D. Demonstrations to the Public – 20 %
 - E. Interaction with Fair Goers – 20 %
